Executive Summary

Over the past 18 months, Homeopaths Without Borders (HWB) has been on the front lines of Haiti's ongoing cholera crisis, delivering urgent homeopathic care directly inside Port-au-Prince's displacement camps. These camps—home to tens of thousands—lack clean water, sanitation, and access to even the most basic medical services.

Thanks to the tireless work of Haitian homeopaths trained by HWB and the support of our generous donors, mobile clinics have provided life-saving treatment and preventive care in some of the most challenging conditions on earth.

This work is entirely donor-supported. Every dollar designated for Haiti goes directly to frontline care. A single clinic day—which includes remedies, staff, and supplies for hundreds—costs just \$600.

Background and Context

Haiti continues to face overlapping crises: escalating violence, mass displacement, and a collapse of basic infrastructure. Families are forced into overcrowded displacement camps where clean water and sanitation are nearly nonexistent. These conditions fuel repeated outbreaks of cholera and other infectious diseases.

In 2024, HWB shifted its mobile clinic model to focus directly inside these camps —bringing cholera treatment, prevention, and health education to families who had no other access to care. This initiative is conducted in close collaboration with the Association of Haitian Homeopaths (AHH) and local community leaders.



Mobile Clinic Model

- Clinics are set up inside displacement camps using portable supplies and a designated clinic room.
- Services include acute care for cholera symptoms, preventive homeopathy, clean water support, and basic health education.
- Clinic sites are selected in partnership with Civil Protection Services, prioritizing safe access for teams and clean water availability.
- All services are provided free of charge.



Team Structure

- Each clinic is staffed by 3–4 Haitian homeopaths, a nurse, and 4–5 assistants handling intake, record-keeping, and dosing.
- Clinical leadership includes MD-trained and professionally certified homeopaths.
- HWB provides continuous mentorship to ensure safe, effective care even in emergency settings.



Clinic Reach (June 2024 - July 2025)

- 24 displacement camps served
- Clinics operate twice-weekly, with follow-up care until cholera cases are eliminated

C CHALLENGES AND ADAPTATIONS

- **Security & Access:** Clinics are sometimes delayed by armed conflict or flooding due to heavy rains
- **Infrastructure Collapse:** Lack of clean water and waste removal increases disease transmission
- **Emerging Threats:** New conditions like dengue-like “Kraze Zo” demand updated remedies and training
- **Adaptation: Teams** use flexible clinic models, portable kits, and strong local partnerships to continue services despite instability.



O ADAPTATION STRATEGIES

- Flexible, mobile clinic model
- Portable kits and pop-up setups
- Strong partnerships with local community leaders for rapid coordination

F FINANCIAL SUMMARY (JUNE 2024 - JULY 2025)

- Total funds sent to Haiti: \$35,467
- Weekly clinic operations: ~\$600/week
- 100% of Haiti-designated funds go to frontline care

F FUTURE GOALS

- Sustain cholera prevention and treatment as outbreaks persist.
- Expand training for Haitian homeopaths amid a shrinking healthcare workforce.
- Secure funding for predictable clinic schedules and emergency response.
- Deepen partnerships with local leaders to strengthen community resilience.

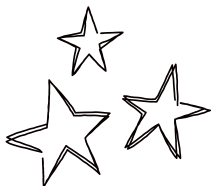
